Section 10-06-01 PEDESTRIANS SUBJECT TO TRAFFIC-CONTROL SIGNALS

Pedestrians shall be subject to traffic-control signals as heretofore declared in Chapter 4 of this Title, but all other places pedestrians shall be granted those rights, and be subject to the restrictions, stated in this Chapter.

Section 10-06-02 PROHIBITED CROSSING

No pedestrian shall cross any street except upon the crosswalk thereof in the restricted parking district as defined in Section 10-11-03 and those through streets as defined by Section 10-09-01.

Section 10-06-03 PEDESTRIANS' RIGHT-OF-WAY IN CROSSWALKS

- A. When traffic-control signals are not in place or not in operation, the driver of a vehicle shall yield the right-of-way, slowing down or stopping if need be to so yield, to a pedestrian crossing the roadway within a crosswalk when the pedestrian is upon the half of the roadway upon which the vehicle is traveling, or when the pedestrian is approaching so closely from the opposite half of the roadway as to be in danger.
- B. Every pedestrian crossing a roadway at any point other than within a marked crosswalk or within an unmarked crosswalk at an intersection shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles upon the roadway.
- C. No pedestrian shall suddenly leave a curb or other place of safety and walk or run into the path of a vehicle which is so close that it is impossible for the driver to yield.
- D. At any crosswalk designated and posted as a "Stop for Pedestrian in Crosswalk", the driver of a vehicle shall stop, to a pedestrian crossing the roadway within the crosswalk, until the crosswalk is unoccupied.
- E. Whenever any vehicle is stopped at a marked crosswalk or at any unmarked crosswalk at any intersection to permit a pedestrian to cross the roadway, the driver of any other vehicle approaching from the rear shall not overtake and pass such stopped vehicle.

Section 10-06-04 PEDESTRIANS WALKING ALONG ROADWAYS

Boise Municipal Code

- A. Where sidewalks are provided it shall be unlawful for any pedestrian to walk along and upon an adjacent roadway.
- B. Where sidewalks are not provided any pedestrian walking along and upon a highway shall, when practical, walk only on the left side of the roadway or its shoulder facing traffic which may approach from the opposite direction.

Section 10-06-05 DRIVERS TO EXERCISE DUE CARE

Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Title, every driver of a vehicle shall exercise due care to avoid colliding with any pedestrian upon any roadway and shall give precaution upon observing any child or any confused or incapacitated person upon a roadway. (Ord. 2864, 4-1-68)

Section 10-06-06 PEDESTRIAN OVERPASSES

- A. At any pedestrian overpass hereinafter described, it shall be unlawful for any pedestrian to cross a roadway within three hundred feet (300') of either side of the overpass except by crossing the roadway on the overpass.
 - 1. Pedestrian overpass on Overland Road at the intersection of Sage Street.
- B. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride any vehicle, motorcycle or bicycle upon a pedestrian overpass. (Ord. 4051, 8-8-77)
